Speech

Hi everyone, my name is Katelyn, I'm the Treasurer for Humans vs. Zombies, and this is Hunter, he's the Vice President of HvZ. I'm here asking for money for our HvZ Zombie Prom. It's an event that we host every year and it's open to anyone on campus. We enjoy bringing in new people to our community. At our height we had about 75 people come, between our players and people outside of the club. We are asking for \$610, which is the same amount we asked for last year. We're ordering about the same amount of stuff, the only thing we are ordering less of is salad because that's the only thing we had leftover of last year. We are still going to have salad and vegetarian options, but we are using the extra money to order more dessert options since we only had chocolate options before. If people don't like chocolate they have other options now, so this gives more options for people. The money will also go towards a raffle which will be a blaster which anyone is eligible to win. We've had a lot of people say that they love the raffle and they come just so they have a chance to win. That is it, we yield to questions.

Question and Answer

Gage: Does Zombie Prom have a theme, even though it's HvZ does it have another theme on top of it?

Katelyn: Yes, we were going to host it in February so it was a Valentine's day theme but the theme is up in the air now because of the date change. In the past we've had Masquerade, Under the Sea...Ideas like that.

Capen: Does your club Fundraise on it's own for this event?

Katelyn: No we don't.

Capen: Does HvZ go to other campuses too?

Katelyn: We do have invitationals for other schools too but Zombie Prom itself is mostly an event for New Paltz students, though you can bring your friends.

Dubois: How long have you been hosting this event?

Hunter: 6 Consecutive years.

Lenape: How do you plan to advertise for this event?

Katelyn: We have a poster, a print out, and we're planning on posting in the Class Pages as well.

Candidate 1:

Hi guys, as you all probably know, My name is Sarah Creighton and I am running for Vice President. Questions

Who did you talk to about this position?

Sarah: I talked to Sam, Elee, Jules; I actually got really good advice from Jules. They told me to make sure I lean on my E-Board for help. They'll give me help if I need it and it takes a lot of guts to do that.

How do you plan on diversifying programming?

Sarah: I'd take feedback from my E-Board members, an organization that works from their own strengths functions best so I'd work off of our strengths and potentially collaborate with an org like Pride. It would be a lot of fun and we could increase representation in RHSA.

What have you learned from your role as Secretary?

Sarah: I actually have learned a lot. I learned that it's really important to speak up and use your voice. I find as secretary I'm often looking at things through a screen so when I want to be heard I have to actually speak up to do so.

If you were to get the position, what are you looking most forward to?

Sarah: Working with my new Executive Board. This year I've made so many strong friendships and I LOVE my E-Board, so I cannot wait to get close to a new group of people.

How do you plan on assisting the President for day to day tasks?

Sarah: I'm very organized, I would help keep everything outlined, planning the little details and helping to lay out exactly what needs to be done, when it needs to be done, and use my time management to ensure that I can do so.

Besides your position as Secretary, what other positions did you hold that will help you to be a good VP?

Sarah: I have a decent amount of experience planning programming, my work in hall gov has helped me plan programs, taught me how to command a room when I need to, come up with the specifics of programming, I've had programs where I didn't get the attendance I wanted and I learned from it and learned how to build on past mistakes.

How would you deal with a conflict between E-Board members?

Sarah: I'd have a one on one conversation with them, everything runs more smoothly if everything is out in the open. If we can't come to a solution after talking to each other, then I would go to the President and if we STILL can't work things out, I'd utilize the advisors as a resource.

What are you looking to get out of this position?

Sarah: I've grown so much this past year and I want to grow more. I want to work on advocacy, growth, and keep improving myself.

What if worse comes to worse and the organization wants to do something but you aren't on board with their idea? What would you do about it?

Sarah: Any decision I would make would be for the best of the E-Board. If there was an organization that wants to collaborate with us and I didn't want to, I'd do what the majority wants. There's a reason we're an E-Board and not one person.

Why do you want to run for Vice President?

Sarah: I love programming and going to SAUS, I like asking if we can get couches, and planning all the minor details of programming. I think all of the details are what's fun about planning programs so I want to do more of that!

So you have had multiple positions on campus. How do you plan to balance them?

Sarah: I'd use Google Calendar, I make to-do lists that are weekly, daily, and even hourly when I need to. I'm very confident that I'd be able to manage my time well.

Do you have any specific ideas about programming?

Sarah: Yes, an Idea for programming that I think would be so much fun is BUZZ Drag Show. I think it would be a lot of fun, and I have more ideas like this but I'd like to see what else my E-Board wants to do first!

How do you plan to work with NRHH?

Sarah: I want to continue to work closer than we have in the past. We've made great strides in getting closer with them this year and I'd like to build on that. An idea that I had to bring us closer is to bring back the Sustainability committee and have NRHH and RHSA co-head this committee but that's only if both organizations are interested, it's just an idea of mine!

You will, if elected, share a lot of responsibilities with the President. Can you explain the differences between the two?

Sarah: Yes, the president will be running Executive Board meetings and Associate Council meetings, while I plan programming. The president does more delegation and executing while I'm going to be planning Fall and Spring Retreats, Catering, Transportation, basically anything and everything programming.

As VP, how will you avoid overstepping your duties and conflicting with the President?

Sarah: I do not want to be the person who's stepping on anybody's toes! I think it's important to have a stable President and VP relationship, I have my responsibilities and I know what my job is. I'm confident, however that if for some reason I were overstepping, Clare would be able to communicate that with me and we could have a conversation to make sure things are running smoothly!

Dubois: The big vending machine is always broken.

Juan: So I sit at CAS Board meetings, very interesting, they're very long, not a fan. But in any case, they are well aware that it sucks. I'm so serious. They said "It would be cheaper to pay someone to distribute the food in there than to keep it running". I'm so serious. So part of the reason why it doesn't work is because the software developers that built it went out of business a few years ago, so

they've been fixing it with the computer tech people on campus who are studying it but they don't know it because it's discontinued software. What they're going to do is renovate it so it's an alcove with 3 BIG vending machines with all the same stuff so it's easier to repair and have.

Dubois: Will it still take dining dollars?

Juan: It should.

Sam: Yeah, that should. Everything's going to remain the same except for the internal mechanism and that should be put in for fall.

Juan: I can double check on the dining dollars though.

Deyo: Relating to a previous concern, we have a full computer science department that can work on it as part of a grad project. I would recommend looking into that.

Juan: I hear your concern but they're set on doing something Cortland implemented mostly because RD Ronnie went to Cortland and it's a good point but the issue is also the mechanism. The big thing that moves around, if the chain gets offset you have to go in and manually repair it and that's too much for them but not to worry, never fear, you're going to get 3 new vending machines. If those are broken, fight someone else I don't know what to tell you.

Dubois: Why do all the other Vending Machines on campus not take dining dollars?

Sam: Those are CAS run not Sodexo run.

Juna: The big Vending Machine is Sodexo run, but CAS runs the other ones. I can ask and see but idk how well that'd go. If we'd have to get new machines it'll be a no.

Collango: On the New Paltz website, there isn't a historian option on the co-curricular transcript.

Marissa: It's on mine for Lenape. Does your hall gov have the position in their constitution?

Collango: You can't select it on the website.

Cam: I can see if I can get it added.

Juan: You may have to ask Jenn.

Cam: Maybe talk to Mark?
