Candidate 1:

Hello everyone, my name is Kevin, before I officially begin my speech, I'd like to distribute some posters, so I've designed posters for condom casino and BUZZ Karaoke. One thing you might notice, is each poster has an alternative version on the back of it, in a horizontal, 16x9 ratio which is the standard dimension for a TV. My idea is that we can send out emails of our posters to the RDs of each hall, and get them on the TVs in more optimal settings. Because currently you lose half the screen, if you're able to have it the dimensions of the TVs, hopefully that will help. So thank you. I'm Kevin, I'm a first year visual arts major, I'm an AC rep in Capen Hall, and I'm hopefully your next PR. I've been learning and practicing graphic design for about five years now, meaning I'm knowledgeable in Adobe's design programs such as photoshop, illustrator, and video editing as well. All of these skills are vital to the PR position. Since arriving here in New Paltz in the Fall, I've fallen in love. I cannot stress that enough. I've fallen in love with the campus and the people here, and RHSA in general. I can thank RHSA for most of the opportunities, people I've met, and connections I've made, and my first would definitely not be the

same without all of you, so thank you. Part of that, is why I'm running today. Experience wise, I serve on the RHSA programming committee as the graphic designer so I do logo design and poster design, and I have plenty new ideas for programming and committees. One committee that I'd love to expand upon is an advertising committee, where students can work together to make commercials for radio and tv stations. I know it's been done before but I'd love to have a chance to lead that committee. In terms of PR responsibilities, I'm aware of the responsibilities such as designing posters, making placards, keeping relations with print shop, and managing the quota for RHSA printing which is \$7.00 per hall. I just want to stress lastly that I care about this organization, and want to do everything in my power to make sure that we have another successful year. I yield to questions.

Questions:

You said you had experience in photoshop, are you self taught or did you learn from someone? **Kevin:** It's a mix of both, I started my first design class when I was in middle school and while I was in that class I realized it was something that I loved doing, so I wanted to continue it. I started learning the programs inside and out, and since then I've taken advertising and graphic design classes all four years of high school and I'm a visual arts major continuing that.

Have you made an effort to learn where the printing room is on campus?

Kevin: Sure, it's right down the hall here. I went down there recently to inquire about something I was doing for my drawing class and I talked to them and know their hours and time constraints.

How do you hope to advertise RHSA events throughout the year, any methods in particular? **Kevin:** I want to continue using the current distribution of posters, also continue social media, and I briefly talked about creating a committee that would be dealing with commercials. I think it would be a really nice way to reach people we may not have reached before, we can work with the radio station, make audio clips, and anyone listening can get info from it.

What other organizations are you involved with around campus, and how would you manage your time?

Kevin: So I'm a part of programming committee, I work Open Houses and I'm a part of Emerging Leaders, which help me to gain leadership skills and I've recently been using google calendar which is a really good way to block out time, you can get notifications straight to your phone, so it's really helpful for keeping track.

Who did you talk to and what is the best advice you've gotten?

Kevin: For PR I talked to Clare, Sam, Elee, and Rui, and for General E-Board things I've talked to Pharez and Marissa. My best piece of advice for PR is time management, understand that there will be times where you need to work quickly, so get your posters done two weeks before your deadlines, so any changes can be fixed early on. For General E-Board, communication has been stressed to me. Make sure to keep one another in the loop, we're all human, so having a balance between relying on people, and being relied on.

What are your strengths?

Kevin: My Creativity,

Kevin: I have a lot of new ideas to keep advertising interesting, so that's the first thing people would see, is original ideas. I've always been a glass half full person so I'm very positive. That'll be a contribution to the E-Board, find positive solutions to the problem.

What is an issue that you see yourself possibly facing, and how would you confront it?

Kevin: One issue could be the Print Shop not being done in time, rush orders, etc. One thing I'd like to work on is getting posters done two weeks before they need to be in, that way I've already talked to them and can anticipate possible issues.

You said you have some ideas for programs?

Kevin: So one of the major things I'd like to expand upon is our collaboration potential. We did a lot of collaboration with Self Care BUZZ, we worked with other organizations. We worked with NRHH, Project Heal, Programming Committee, Music Therapy, and other clubs. That collaboration potential can help not only RHSA but can expand the organizations working with us. A specific idea I had was to unite all of the music clubs on campus. We can really expand our entire campus community through collaboration.

What do you hope to gain, if elected.

Kevin: I think I have a lot to gain, by really working on a team. I'd be working with a very close knit, active group. We'd really need to work together. Everything needs to run smoothly. By working with a team on a daily basis, I'd have experience with everything collaborative. Listening to people, increasing communication skills to have the whole experience.

What is a weakness you have?

Kevin: I have been self critical in the past, especially artwise. Nobody wants to walk around thinking they're not doing their best. I also use that to push me to do my best work. I've been trying to be more proud of what I'm doing and really accepting compliments, so be confident in your ability.

Would you want to reach out to art and design clubs on campus to expand?

Kevin: Sure, I know Design Society I haven't gotten to go to yet but there are a lot of art focused clubs, and combining organizations to make something bigger is definitely on my agenda.

What can you bring to the Executive Board?

Kevin: I can bring myself. I pride myself in being hardworking, energetic, and passionate. If I get elected I promise I will do exactly that. I will not stop working until we can bring the best possible programs and events to all of you.

What is a Challenge you may face next year?

Kevin: I think something as simple as a disagreement can be a challenge. Everyone has different ideas, and while I'm making my own designs, everyone has their own ideas. So I'd like to take everyone's ideas into account to make it the best I can. I can learn from my experiences and get better.

If you found out that you made an error on a poster, how would you respond?

Kevin: If it was before it's printed, I would immediately correct it in the original files. One thing in design that I always do is leave source files intact so that can be done. If it's after printing, there's not as much that can be done, so I'd point out that there was a mistake, correct the issue with a post it or something, but in terms of a general spelling mistake, everybody makes mistakes sometimes, we're only human and I'll do my best to avoid it.

How will you work to bring us closer to NRHH?

Kevin: I think through program collaboration, and then continuing the work having representation from both organizations at meetings, so having members like Kendall or Jacob. Having the same presentation and have a briefing session to explain. Continue that. More collaboration to get people knowing.

How would you handle an issue with a fellow E-Board member?

Kevin: I think speak to them directly. Everybody deserves it to be dealt with privately and get their understanding. Set expectations, explain how you're feeling. Get a good understanding and reach a conclusion, and go to the president if needed.

What would you do if you spent a long time working on a poster and another E-Board member didn't like it?

Kevin: Ask what they found problematic, maybe they didn't think there was enough effort or they didn't like the subject matter, and work with the entire E-Board because we are a team. We need to think about what's best for everyone. If the consensus is that the poster needs to be changed, I'd design something that would better suit the needs of the E-Board.

Candidate 2:

Hi everyone, my name is Ishrat Ali, I use she/her/hers pronouns, and I hope to be the next PR. This is my first year at New Paltz and this is my second semester. I'm a graphic design major so advertising and design is not only a special skill of mine, but also a hobby. I'm running to be the next PR for several reasons, but the main reason is because I want to be a part of an organization that grows community. I'm from Queens, I thought it would be a tough decision to come here because I didn't know anybody here at New Paltz. I was actually surprised at how well my first semester went because I got involved with hall government, got close to the RAs in my hall, and I made friends. I feel like the duties of the PR are to have the posters done 2-3 weeks in advance, have placards done 2-3 weeks in advance for each member, 2 for each halls, for the advisors, and for the NRHH representative. As a member I'd attend all meetings and events. I'd promote events on facebook and social media. A PR should have good time management skills. They will have to make posters in advance. It's also very important to be creative. People think it's a simple job but you need to know your audience and make it appealing for the whole campus. The whole purpose is advertising for the community, for New Paltz, not just for the E-Board. It's created for everyone. I'll be handing out this folder with fliers I created for Hall Government programs. I'm excited to be working with a new E-Board and bring new ideas to RHSA. I yield to questions.

Ouestions:

You said you're a graphic design major, so what kinds of experience do you have with designing posters?

Ishrat: I started with photoshop in middle school and continued that here, I also started Illustrator in high school and I interned in design last year.

Have you made an effort to learn where the printing room is in New Paltz?

Ishrat: Yes, I worked with them last semester, we were creating programs during thanksgiving and we decided to get a big poster for a bunch of programs, and I learned that you do have to have the posters in at least a few weeks in advance.

What are some challenges you think you may face?

Ishrat: I think that being on Executive Board is a big time commitment. As PR, time management you would need how to control it. You need to have the posters done in advance so you have time to advertise.

What would you say your strengths are?

Ishrat: I believe my communication skills. Last semester my Hall Gov had some issues with communication, but once we started talking about our issues we upped our game.

What is one weakness you care to share and how can you overcome that?

Ishrat: I self criticize a lot in my art work. As an art major, you get criticized a lot but that's a strength because you grow from it and you can make yourself better.

You mentioned community a lot. How do you believe you can expand the RHSA community? Something I had in mind, was a 3 day program every semester for first year students, transfer students, and international students to help them feel welcome. Something else I wanted to talk about was advertising of program near Hasbrouck or on the TV screens.

What would you do if you spent a long time making a poster and then an E-Board member didn't like it?

Ishrat: I would defend my design, but if it's something they feel strongly about, I'd take that into consideration.

What do you hope to gain from this?

Can you elaborate on what intrigued you about the position?

How would you handle a mistake made on a poster?

How do you feel your experiences on Hall Gov will help you on E-Board?

Ishrat: As PR, I learned how to work with a community. PR taught me how to become a leader and work with a team. Last semester we worked on communication, and this semester we started working out our problems and mastered them.

What can you bring to the E-Board?

I think I work well in a group, Especially on an Executive Board. I love getting to know new people. You're moving to a whole different organization, RHSA is definitely different from Hall Government but I am excited to work with new people and design posters. I really enjoy designing posters.

How would you work to bring us closer to NRHH?

Ishrat: I think that it's important to have that communication with a lot of organizations, and NRHH is the National Residence Hall Honorary, so we can have programs with them and collaborate.

If you had an issue with another E-Board member, how would you handle it?

Ishrat: I would first take time to think about it, I'd then talk to them and find the root of what's causing it. Sometimes people don't feel comfortable

Candidate 3:

Alright, good evening Associate Council. My name is Ryan Tso, I'm a second year student, I'm majoring in public relations, and I'd like to be your next PR. I believe I would be a great PR, because firstly, my

experiences last year as an AC rep, and now ascending to the position of Hall Government President this year, each year taking on more and more responsibility. LEadership skills, public speaking, programming, and more. I want to expand the role of PR, working more closely with the historian to appeal more to incoming students, whether first year, transfer, or international. I also want to work closer with NRHH. Work with their PR and expand both organizations. I'd also like to further advertising in RHSA, because I know, as marketing is a part of my major, you need to work with advertising audio and visually as well. I have knowledge of adobe photoshop and illustrator. I also have apps on my phone so I can work anytime, anywhere. I believe this can help keep more organized, along with my google calendar on my phone. I also believe I should be creative. I would like to let the AC have voice in advertising platforms. Questions:

Have you made the effort to learn where the printing room is?

Ryan: Yes I have.

You said you have experience with adobe, how much experience and how long have you been using it?

Ryan: So I've actually been using it through Junior and Senior year of high school. I took a break from it, but I've been preparing and relearning it this year.

Do you have experience making posters?

Ryan: It's not exactly the same, but one thing I do is I help my coach run the social media so I make a lot of brochures for incoming recruits.

You said you wanted to appeal to freshmen, transfer, and international students. How do you want to do that?

Ryan: So I'm thinking of the BBQ, a promo video, commercials. I know a diverse set of people, we can have help with a language barrier.

Do you have any particular methods for how you'd advertise RHSA events?

Ryan: I'd like to work with the Historian, use the instagram more. Get hall govs involved. Halls and Buddy Halls can do advertisements together, people can send it out and people will see that RHSA is a family. A great place to be.

If one of your fellow E-Board members doesn't like a poster you worked hard on, how would you deal with that?

Ryan: So I would probably try to see their side of it, see the creative differences, and be open minded. However, I believe my work is the best, but if there's a consensus I'd be ready to change it.

Who have you talked to about this position and what would you say the best advice was?

Ryan: I talked to Clare, Sam, Elee, and exchanged emails with Tara Sestanovich. The best advice I have gotten is to stay organized. There's a lot to do, staying organized, use calendars to stay on schedule, make sure things are done early, be strict and routine with myself.

What made you choose this position?
