Question & Answer

Why do you want to be president of RHSA?

Can you name us a few skills you excel in and/or can grow in once you take on this position?

Discussion:

- We feel it was very interesting to start with a story and metaphor that initially wouldn't be seen as something to talk about in a formal setting like this, but her ability to work it into a metaphor for how she works as a person and how she sees problems or discourse is something that is very valuable.
- We appreciate the incorporation of an interesting seemingly unattached story into the speech, but we also have concerns because the story made it seem like the candidate does not take the job seriously at first glance.
- We feel the response to some of the questions on the sheet, especially to the question "Why do you want to be RHSA president?", are a little more self reflective and not about how they could contribute to the organization as a whole- it was more about how being president could contribute to their resume.
- It is very impressive that the candidate works three jobs in addition to taking 18 credits, and assuming they are doing well in all of those they seem like a very qualified individual to take on a pretty demanding role.
- We agree with that point. Also to the point of Abby bringing in a story into the speech and starting with something silly, it was definitely creative and brought a little fun to the meeting, which we think is important for RHSA because we're not all serious all the time. It showed the little bit of fun that is necessary in the leader of an organization of college kids who are always stressed and need to have fun every once in a while.
- We feel there were some contradictions in responses around delegation, not being able to ask for help, and taking accountability.
- We would appreciate it if they had listed more alternatives in terms of how they could get better at asking for help. We needed to hear more examples of that in order to feel confident in their ability to handle situations where they can't do everything on their own.
- We were refreshed by how honest they were. It's nice to see people admit their weaknesses instead of pretending they're invincible, because we all have weaknesseseven presidents.
- We also appreciate the fact that they feel they can grow from taking on the position, and we feel that they can truly succeed.
- To extend off that point, through the speech and way they answered questions, they came
 off as seeming to have not only physical endurance but mental endurance as well. We see
 that playing well into such a heavy job as RHSA president.

The sinks were filled with green water and smelled terrible. I would like to make sure the sinks are not clogged with water anymore.

Gage: Especially seeing as Earth Day is coming up, I am really concerned with the Humans Versus Zombies club leaving Nerf bullets everywhere. This was happening in the fall too.

Emily: I know there's something in their constitution that states they're not allowed to leave any debris out in the open. I'll definitely try to contact them about it first to see if they can pick up after themselves to make sure it's not polluting everywhere.

Bouton: They end up in the Bouton hall front garden area.

Esopus: And there are always a lot on Parker Quad.

Gage: I'm especially concerned about the Gunk and the area near Esopus, because animals live there.

Esopus: It would be good to bring it up ASAP because next they have a week-long event going on next week where anyone who wants to can be in play anytime they are on campus.

Gage: They play at night and do the clean up in the morning, but the ammo rolls away. Someone said they watched a bird pick one up and fly away with it. They do play in the gym sometimes, which I like.

Emily: I'll definitely check in with them on that.

Lenape: There are also dogs that go around campus, like Bandit, who could potentially ingest anything HVZ leaves behind.

Gage: Speaking of Bandit, it doesn't seem fair that dogs should be let around campus off the leash and come up to people when some people on campus might be afraid of dogs.

Emily: I'm not sure what we can do about that, but I'll definitely inquire with a couple people to make sure that people who walk their dogs on campus are keeping them off the leash so they don't bother people.

Gage: We don't want to assume any of the dogs on campus are vicious or anything, but others might be so it would be a good policy to implement.

Ashokan: Speaking of that, wouldn't it also be a safety hazard? Because I've seen the hawks on campus swoop at people and animals. A lot of people happen to own small animals on campus and if they let them loose on campus the hawks become a danger to the pet. That should be preached a little more because I see people walking on campus with small animals off the lease.

Esopus: The stairs between Wooster and Coykendall going down toward the Lecture Center still have flickering lights and a couple of broken ones. The flickering ones are the biggest concern because we have students with epilepsy, and then they either need to completely avoid going near there at night or close their eyes, which is not safe.

Emily:Have you noticed any other flickering lights, or just those by the stairs?

Esopus: I think just those at the moment.

Gage: I'm going to contact the parking committee about this, but it's really wrong that parking tickets accrue late fees because profiting off of wrongdoings is bad and not pro-restorative justice, but also students who are living paycheck to paycheck, are sending money home, etc. who can't pay their parking tickets shouldn't be penalized for that. I'm sick of it.
