SENATE 9:14 PM

Chet: I'll reiterate at the end of my report as well, but elections for all Student Association officer positions and all Senate seats open at midnight tonight. It will also be open until noon on Thursday, so you have time. Please make sure you vote at some point in the next coming days. It's really important to get people into these seats, especially because this year is a referendum year for the student activities fee. For anyone who doesn't know, the student activity fee funds all of the Student Association clubs on campus. Our referendum is every two years. We vote to see if it remains mandatory or becomes a voluntary fee. It being a mandatory fee gives us the budget necessary to run each year and if it becomes voluntary we will likely lose all of our budget and not be able to run the Student Association at all. It's very important it stays mandatory and we need at least 10% of the student body to vote for it to count, so that's 660 people. Make sure you get everyone you know to go on Engage starting tomorrow to vote for that, as well as everyone who's running for positions because we need a student government in order to use that budget properly. Any questions about elections?

Lenape: Can grad students be part of the Senate?

Chet: Yes. There is a specific Senate seat to be filled by a grad student, and I believe all of the EBoard positions are open to graduates as well. The nomination period has closed but there will also likely next semester be elections for any seats that were not filled this semester. Anything else for elections? Okay. Also, I mentioned a few weeks ago that we will be having an event with Soul Fire farms. That will be happening at the end of next week. I'm still in communication with them about when exactly that will be happening. We will be putting up advertising materials for that soon. The event will be a virtual one talking about ending racism in the food system, so if you're interested please come by. The link will be coming out soon. Lastly, this Thursday there will be a rally outside JFT and Humanities, weather dependent. The forecast doesn't look good but we're still going to do something, either in front of Humanities or in the farmers market. This is for a group called TIAA Divest!; TIAA is a conglomerate that has a lot to do with SUNY schools finances as a kind of investment broker. They are also deeply invested in many oil companies including Chevron and several Russian oil groups. This rally is to show them that we

are not in support of that and that if they want our continued patronage they will divest from all of those companies. It will start at noon and go to 1pm. It will either be at the farmers market or outside Humanities, depending on the weather. Does anyone have any questions? Thank you.

- D. Assigns "hall buddies" for Executive Board members and Hall Governments;
- E. Updates the GFP Packet at their discretion;
- F. Maintains communication with the Department of Residence Life and National Residence Hall Honorary (NRHH);
- G. Communicates event information with Resident Assistant Liaisons and Hall Governments (i.e. RA Appreciation Day, Hall Government Appreciation Day, etc.);
- H. Serves as a resource and mentor for Hall Government Liaisons regarding Hall Government;
- I. Maintains the Hall of the Semester and Spirit Weekend plaques;
- J. Updates the RHSA Constitution as needed following any legislative changes or friendly amendments;
- K. Coordinates volunteers for RHSA events.

Candidate 1:

Hi AC and EBoard. I'm Sophia Root, I use she/her pronouns, and I'm running for the position of Campus Communications Coordinator. I am a freshman here at New Paltz and I'm a communications major with a concentration in organizational communication. I'm currently the president of Bliss hall government. Last semester I helped lead my government to Hall of the Semester, which we were awarded at banquet, and I was personally awarded an EBoard Choice Award. You may not know, but Hall of the Semester is determined by whoever has the most GFPs. As president, I helped my EBoard get as many GFPs as we could so I'm pretty knowledgeable in the methods of harvesting them. CCC is in charge of GFPs, so I think I'm qualified to manage them. I'm pretty enthusiastic about gathering GFPs. CCC also communicates with NRHH and Residence Life, and I am a newly elected chapter member of NRHH so I have connections there and will go to their weekly meetings. I think it's another position I can take on that integrates into my schedule and is pretty convenient. But I don't want you to think I'm just doing this out of convenience. I really am passionate about Residence Life and making New Paltz a great place to live. Earlier I mentioned that I was an EBoard Choice during fall banquet. When I was receiving the award, the presenter expressed some concerns about engagement and enthusiasm in hall government and RHSA after Covid, and how I really brought some enthusiasm. I am humbled by that award, but I do also think I have a particular advantage because I joined RHSA at one of the lowest points of engagement because of Covid. We're all going through it right now. I think at this point there's nowhere to go but up and I would like to help in any way I can. With that, I yield to questions.

Emily: We will now have 5 minutes of Question & Answer extendable up to 3 times. We will be using the speakers list and you can raise your placard when you have a question.

Question & Answer:

How do you handle group conflict, especially when the success of an organization depends on your teamwork?

Sophia: I like teamwork a lot, and I like to get to the root of any conflict. I try to see everyone's perspective so we can come to a negotiation or solution that benefits all parties. I do think conflicts get in the way of productivity so it is best not to brush them under the rug, and just address them as soon as possible. I am a very honest person so I like to deal with things as openly as possible.

How do you see the CCC position as helping you with your academic career going forward?

Sophia: I am a communications major and do want to do something in that field. I'm very passionate about it and have been since I was young. Other than it literally being in the job description, I feel like getting that kind of experience on the EBoard with team members will better suit me for my future workplace environment.

You have quite a heavy workload, which is honorable so congratulations to you. How do you plan to manage your workload with this responsibility in a way that helps not only the system, but yourself.

Sophia: My time management skills are dependent on how connected everything in my life is. I really live by a mode of synergy. My academics are closely related to this position so I feel like

as I learn in the classroom I can also learn and hone my leadership skills on the EBoard, which leads to personal growth and growth of the organization.

How do you feel the variety of things you have done on campus will help with this position?

Sophia: I do like to collect leadership positions and opportunities and, as I said before, they're all pretty synergetic. I feel like the variety helps with conflict resolution and I do have some experience mitigating and resolving conflicts that appear. I like to gain different perspectives and different leadership roles, so I feel like my extracurriculars at this school so far have really helped me understand how to solve those issues.

What new ideas and programs will you bring to RHSA?

Sophia: I don't really know. Those in my hall gov can agree with me when I say I'm not the best with coming up with programs. Sometimes I need the help of other people. I'm not entirely certain I could bring an idea into fruition by myself, so I will rely on the rest of my EBoard to help me come up with ideas. It's all about teamwork, and I'll help as much as I can.

I noticed in your application that you listed your greatest weakness as being judgemental. Can you expand on that?

Sophia: Sometimes I jump to conclusions about things. I want to find an answer quickly so that can sometimes lead to hasty resolutions. I have been improving on that through my leadership here, and at every challenge I face I feel I personally grow from it and it helps me learn for the future.

HALL CONCERNS 10:10 PM

Emily: If there's something wrong in your hall that you have already talked to your RAs, SRA, and RD about and nothing has been done, this is your time to tell us.

Lenape: We have a concern about Lenape's oven because it is very broken. There is a note that says the heat isn't the correct temperature, causing the food to burn, and the light won't turn on.

Emily: I know there is a separate person to fix ovens, so I'll definitely get in contact with Roman. Are the lights fixed at all?

Lenape: No. One is still flickering and the other is still off.

Emily: Okay, we'll keep trying.

Ashokan: We have two dryers that have been broken for three weeks. We've spoken to the person from facilities and they've just been perpetually broken. It's making it hard for those in the building to keep laundry cycles going.

Emily: Did the door ever get fixed? Does everyone have card access?

Ashokan: No, that never got fixed.

Gage: One of our showers on the second floor has been flooding on the floor and our SRA said it's how the floor is built, but the other showers next to it don't flood. It might also be related to a leak on the first floor. On the first floor, if you take a shower cold water drips on your head.

Emily: Which wing is that, or which room number is that by?

Gage: Past the RA office on the left, it's a smaller women's bathroom with only two showers. Both in the standing changing area and inside the shower the ceiling leaks, and the second floor floods.

Esopus: We are also having dryer issues. We have, out of the sixteen dryers, four that are functional. No matter what cycle you run it on, the clothes are still damp. A couple don't even start. Within my own friend group are several members of ResLife, so it is definitely something people are aware of.

Emily: I'll definitely check in on that as well.

Scudder: Our washing machines are not working. They were already out of order over the spring break. I alerted the RA and SRA and they still have not been fixed.

Emily: Okay, I'll check on that. Any other hall concerns? Any other dryers or washing machines that have been out of order since spring break?

Gage: In the laundry room close to the elevator, almost none of the dryers work. They work, but it took me three or four cycles to dry my clothes.

Emily: Okay. Any other hall concerns? 3, 2, 1. Seeing none. If you have any more, feel free to reach out to your RAs, SRAs, and RDs. But if they don't get back to you, always email us at rhsa@newpaltz.edu. I have been trying to have a meeting with Steve Deutch to talk about the concerns we've been having with food services. We're still trying to set a time, but I did learn that the bad smell in Peregrine is caused by them not flushing out a pipe behind Sweets and Treats. I'm going to work with them on how to get that fixed long term so it doesn't smell like that all the time. At least now we know how.
