SENATE: 9:25

Ann: Hey. First and foremost I wanted to give you guys an update on the benches situation. So, for anyone who was not here last meeting. You might notice the stone benches over by the gunk between Awosting and Gage. Those benches were updated over the winter break to display the names of the settlers of New Paltz and the founders of the university. These are the same people who the Peregrine quad. complex used to be named later. The names were changed because these individuals owned enslaved people. So, I met with Tahana, our chief diversity officer, and it was me, a Vice President from the Black Student Union and the council chair at the student association office. I found out a lot of information from Tahana who explained that the bench is not complete and it needs to be updated. The intention of the bench is to present a holistic approach to the history of SUNY New Paltz. Formally what people understood to be the forming of New Paltz was the founding huguenots and the huguenots were slave owners and we sort of honored those people by naming buildings after them. So, after the names were changed in 2019, people wanted to make sure the history was not erased, but strengthened by presenting the whole story. So, the bench is supposed to be completed to include the history of indigenous and african people who also were part of the founding of the town and university. It's far from a perfect project, and sort of what we found out this morning is that the intention of the project is more or less unchangeable. The university at this point has spent too much time and money in it to change the project in it's entirety and at this point the bench has been constructed and the plaques have been put up. So, it was kind of disheartening that the university would not be responsive to a whole lot of our feedback. We did find out there are places students can get involved. So, for example, the statements on the contributions of African and Indigenous people haven't been completed yet. So, at this morning's meeting we advocated for the black studies department and the Black Student Union to be involved in the writing of the statement on the contributions of Africans. Tahana was very supportive of that idea. We're bringing it up at Wednesday's President Cabinet meeting because there are other members other than Tahana who also worked on this project. This is a very bureaucratic process we have to go through, but so far we have the university's support on that. Also, we're advocating with Tahana's support for a section of the space to be dedicated to the former faculty and staff members of the black studies department. Recognizing that too often Black History is sized down to only enslavement. We feel at this point in time that the benches would continue on that trend, so to move away from it we wanted to highlight that black people are a very important part of our campus community and always have

been and contribute very strongly to us academically. I'll be able to give you guys a better update on it after we see how Wednesday's meeting goes. That's where we're at right now.

Mohonk: I know that you being involved in this. I was wondering if you could talk about another issues that came about recently. It came about on the 1st, but in front of Ridgeview there's a dog leash that's on a tree and it's tied in the form of a noose. And it's unsettling with it being there at the start of Black History Month. Especially in front of Ridgeview because it's a very open area and they're very informative with the LGBTQ+ community. I was talking with my fellow classmates in my black history class, and honestly I don't know what their intentions were, but I know the impact was very negative. Especially to black students. It's very weird for the noose to be tied up and seeing students talk about lynchings in the start of Black History Month. I find it very offensive. Is there any way you can look into that and find out more about it.

Ann: I actually did not find out about it until today because I'm a part of the black lives matter at the school collective that's here. It's a very cool space and group we have on campus, and I recommend that people get involved. There's an email they send out at the end of every meeting. That is actually how I found out about that. I don't, at this point in time, know who to go to about it. I can tell you that the black studies department is aware and ResLife is also aware. I know that ResLife reports up to Mike Patterson and Stephanie Blaisdell. So, they should know about it if they do not know already.

Mohonk: I'm confused on why it's still up and the campus has not taken it down.

Ann: I am also confused. Currently, it's not on Wednesday's meeting agenda, and they're pretty strict about us sticking to that agenda, but this is a big enough issue that we are going to talk about.

Abby: I can add it to the agenda.

Ann: The other sort of update that I have is that Senate it partnering with the Disabilities Resource Center on the know your rights programming because we recognize that with students with disabilities on campus, both disabilities that are documented and not documented, that advocating to your professor that you're elected to get these accommodations is one of the most common struggles that we have to go through. So, we're going to put on at least one program, possibly a series of programs, on advocating for yourself and how to sound professional and professors will take you seriously. Unfortunately academia is pretty classist and there's a certain way of talking to certain professors and we wanted to make sure everyone has the best chance possible at advocating for themselves in academic spaces. So, I will be able to give you guys updates on when I have the first meeting tomorrow. Then finally, because I can't be here at the end, NPAD is on Saturday. It's a self love festival. Downstairs in SUB 62/63 from 8:30pm-10:00pm I'd love for you guys to be there to engage in some self love.

Shawangunk: With the disabilities, I was not sure who I should reach out to, you or blackboard, or I don't know where to go. But blackboards website is not allowing access to open dyslexia. For students who are dyslexic they have this app that is able to allow websites to turn into open dyslexic so it's easier for us to read. Unfortunately Blackboard did have this option now

brightspace does not. So, I have to take everything I have. Is there any possibilities for Brightspace to allow that to open.

Ann: The person I am meeting with tomorrow is Emi DiSciullo, she is the learning support specialist. So, this is her specialty and I will be sure to bring it up.
