Concussion is Not Just a Bump on The Head: Supporting Students with Brain Injury

Presented by Margo Singer

According to the CDC, brain injury is the most frequent cause of disability and death among children and adolescents in the United States. Each year, more than one million children sustain brain injuries ranging from mild to severe. Children and adolescents are as vulnerable to trauma as adults; however the extent of trauma may not be immediately apparent because the child's brain is still developing.

All students are at risk, not just the student athlete. Problems seen in children subsequent to brain injury can include deficits in attention and concentration, memory, organizational skills, changes in behavioral functioning, social skills, and emotional control. Such sequelae often present significant challenges for school staff who struggle to meet their unique needs.

This training will provide teachers and support staff with an overview of brain injury in children, how it may manifest itself in the classroom, and how to respond --including a best practices protocol which utilizes a team approach within the school (REAP), and free resources available to school districts to help children, their families, and school personnel, including the BIANYS FACTS Program and LEARNET, an interactive computer program to assist teachers address the challenges posed by students with brain injury. The free FACTS Program is available to assist individuals who sustain a brain injury prior to the age of 22 and BIANYS has FACTS Coordinators in every region of the state.




