

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WHAT WILL WE DO IN THIS COURSE?

explore theories about women, gender, and sexuality through interdisciplinary and disciplinary lenses such as anthropology, biology, political economy, history, literary studies, politics, philosophy, and sociology

focus on the ways that (a) ideas, identities, norms, and practices associated with gender and sexuality are embedded in social institutions; (b) how those institutions influence our lives; and (c) how they confer *privileges* to some groups and *disadvantages* to others

analyze both interpersonal and structural forms of power (and their relationship to one another) by applying a *feminist intersectional perspective* to an analysis of identity and experience.
